



Nicola Field has been a writer, artist and socialist activist for 35 years. Her book 'Over The Rainbow' ('OtR') explores identity politics and calls for a fight for sexual liberation firmly based on class and the roots of oppression. Nicola was an original member of Lesbians and Gays Support the Miners (LGSM) and Lesbians Against Pit Closures, which featured in the hit film Pride. 'OtR' contains the first ever account of LGSM ever published in a book. She lives on Peckham and is a founder member of the new campaign Stand up to LGBTQ+ Hate Crime.






